Dustbins and Recycling Bins

The bins are in the vegetable garden near the greenhouse at the bottom of the yard. We recycle glass, newspapers and magazines, cans and plastic, bulbs and batteries. Compostable, uncooked vegetable waste can be placed in the compost bin in the vegetable garden. Cooked food can be placed in the brown bin. Bins go to the end of our drive on Wednesday evenings, rubbish is collected on Thursday at 8.00am.

Electricity

The electric trip switches are in the hall cupboard. There is a grey fuse box with six switches. All the switches should be up. If any are down, try pushing the switch up. If it fails to reset, it usually indicates that there may be a faulty appliance or lightning. Please unplug any appliances and try again. Please let us know if you have further problems.

E-mail and wi-fi

There is free Internet in all the accommodation.

Fire

Do not touch the fire or chimney when alight.

Briquettes are in the small shed in the yard beside the garden gate, sticks are in the metal barrel near the log store in the yard (please ask if they are not apparent). Logs are stacked in the log store in the corner of the yard between the Farmhouse and the Haybarn. Please wash your hands after handling the sticks as mice live in the sheds where the wood is kept. Please empty ash daily, when cold put in large waste bin near greenhouse. **To light fire:** Use 2 or 3 sticks stacked up on 1 or 2 eco blaze firelighters, when sticks are alight and hot air has warmed chimney, add a couple of briquettes.

Twisting the fire's lower door handle regulates draft. **Please ensure there is enough ventilation in the room when using the fire.**

Organics and Trees

Beechenhill became a fully organic farm in June 2000. An organic system uses no chemical fertiliser or spray. It relies on the natural system of clover taking nitrogen from the atmosphere and making it available to grass, as well as spreading composted manure. Animals are not routinely treated with antibiotics and are fed at least 95% organic foods, and no genetically modified organisms. An organic system aims to maintain the diversity of the wildlife and environment. Beechenhill became one of a network of demonstration farms for the Soil Association, holding farm walks for those interested in organic farming.

In 2022 Terry retired from milking. Some land was sold and the remaining land is let to a neighbouring farmer. The land to the north and west has been planted with 4,835 native trees to form an open canopy mixed woodland.

Principles of Organic Farming and growing

To work as much as possible within a closed system

To maintain the long-term fertility of the soil

To avoid all forms of pollution

To produce foodstuffs of high nutritional quality and sufficient quantity

To reduce the use of fossil energy

To give livestock conditions of life that conform to their physiological needs and humanitarian principles

For agricultural producers to earn a living

To use appropriate technology and to develop decentralised systems.

If you discover a fire

- Raise the alarm by operating the nearest fire alarm call point or alerting us in Cowmans Cottage, ring the doorbell or knock on the door.
- Call the fire service by dialling 999 and asking for the Fire Brigade.
- The cottage's What/3/Words location is *scrolled.melts.degree*.

- Ensure everyone leaves the premises by the nearest safe exit.
- Ensure that people do not re-enter the premises.
- If safe to do so, remove any compressed gas cylinders from the area of the fire.
- Report to the assembly point: **Front farmyard**

If you hear the fire alarm

- Leave the building by the nearest exit.
- Do not stop to collect personal belongings
- Report to the assembly point: **Front farmyard**
- Do Not re-enter the premises unless authorised to do so.

Fire-fighting equipment

- Fire Blanket in Kitchen

Means of escape routes

- Via entrance door (BC, CBP, WH)
- Via sitting room door (CBP)
